EXPORT TRADE CONTROL.

No.E(C) 1977/AM(271):- In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Imports and Exports (Control) Act, 1947, (18 of 1947), the central Government hereby makes the following order further to amend the exports (control) Order, 1977, namely :-

- 1- This order may be called the exports (Control) Eighteenth Amendment order, 1983.
- 2- In the exports (Control) order, 1977, in OGL-3, in col.4 against S.No.1 the following following shall be added after condition No.(11):-
III Quarantine of Buffaloes for a minimum period of 21 days during which period the buffaloes will be subject to inspection and vaccination for rinderpest foot and mouth disease and will also be tested for tuberculosis and brucellosis."

PUBLIC NOTICE NO. 23-MTU(MN)/84.

Subject :- Export Policy of Live Buffaloes and Live Sheep and Goat (Adult) - Conditions regarding

As mentioned in para 3 (1) of Public Notice No. 21-MTU(MN)/84 dated the 10th September, 1984 on the above subject.

2. It has been decided to amend the paragraph 3(1) of Public Notice No. 21-MTU(MN)/84 dated 10th September 1984 to read as under:-

"The quarantine would be done under the overall supervision of Govt. of India. The Director of Animal Husbandry, Maharashtra or any other Officer authorised on his behalf for Live Buffaloes and Sheep (Adult) intended to be exported from Bombay, and the Director of Animal Husbandry, Gujarat or any other officer authorised on his for Live Buffaloes and Sheep (Adult) to be exported from Kambli port respectively are authorised to issue a certificate on behalf of Government of India in respect of quarantine before export of live animals is allowed. The Director, Department of Sheep and Wool, Government of Rajasthan, or his authorised representative would issue certificate in respect of sheep put up in quarantine within the state of Rajasthan."

3. All other conditions contained in the aforesaid public notice shall remain unchanged.

Sub : Export Policy of Live Buffaloes and
Live sheep during 1983-84 - Condi-
tions Regarding.

Attention is invited to export policy of Live
Buffaloes and Live sheep as indicated against S.No. 2
and 3 of the Police Statement at page 8 of Import and
Export policy April, 1983 - March 1984, (Vol. II).

2. In order to ensure that only healthy animals
are exported it has been decided that Live sheep and
Live Buffaloes before actual export, will be kept in
Quarantine for a minimum period of 21 days during which
period the animals will be subjected to inspection and
vaccination. During this period the sheep will be
vaccinated for Rinderpest, Foot and Mouth disease and
Sheep Pox. Similarly, buffaloes will be vaccinated for
Rinderpest, Foot and Mouth disease and will also be
tested for Tuberculosis and Brucellosis.

3. Accordingly in col. 3, against S. NO. 3 of the Policy statement at Page 8 of Import and Export Policy Book 1983-84 (Vol. II) the following sub-condition No. (iv) shall be added:-

- (iv) Quarantine of sheep for a minimum period of 21 days during which period the sheep will be subjected to inspection and vaccination for Rinderpest, Foot and Mouth disease and sheep Pox.

4. As regards export of Live Buffaloes, conditions mentioned in paragraph 2 above have been incorporated in GGL-5 vide Exports (Control) Amendment Order No. E(C)O, 1977/AM(271) dated the 19th September, 1983.

5. The following procedure will be followed for export of Live Buffaloes and sheep:

- (i) Export of Live Buffaloes and sheep shall be allowed from Bombay and Kandla Ports only.
- (ii) Supervision of Government of India, The Director of Animal Husbandry, Maharashtra for Live Buffaloes and sheep intended to be exported from Bombay and the Director of Animal Husbandry, Gujarat for Live Buffaloes and sheep to be exported from Kandla Port respectively are authorized to issue a certificate on behalf of Government of India in respect of quarantine, before export of Live animals is allowed. Director, Department of Sheep and Wool Rajasthan, would issue certificate in respect of sheep put up in quarantine within the state of Rajasthan.
- (iii) The Exporters interested to export Live Buffaloes and sheep would offer premises for purpose of quarantine. The premises would be inspected by the State Directors of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Service for the purpose of infrastructure facilities and after examination of the premises, the same will be declared as approved quarantining stations for the purpose of undertaking quarantine prior to export.
- (iv) All animals subjected to quarantine would be identified by 'Ear Tag'. The number of 'Ear Tags' shall be mentioned in the certificate of the quarantine issued by the certifying authority.
- (v) The exporters would pay the cost of the vaccines used for the vaccination of the animals.

6. Quarantine procedure laid down in paragraph 5 may not be insisted upon where the foreign buyers have specifically contracted for export without quarantine formalities. Exporters shall produce contract (in original) to this effect to the licensing authority.

7. Pre-change commitment in respect of sheep shall be honoured only for the quantities for which the export licences have already been issued by the licensing authorities and is backed by the irrevocable letters of credit. In respect of Live Buffaloes pre-change commitment shall be honoured in terms of paragraph 225 of the Handbook.

Import and Export Procedure 1983-84. In case of
change commitment, quarantine procedure shall not be
applicable.

8. Export of Live Goats shall continue to be
allowed without any quarantine and vaccination formalities,
and would be subjected to general veterinary
inspection and certification as hitherto.
